Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of Fineline Hospitality & Consultancy Pte Ltd (the Company) set out on pages 6 to 15 which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2014 and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes.

Directors' responsibilities

1. Incorporation

Fineline Hospitality & Consultancy Pte Ltd was a Category 2 Global Business Licence company incorporated on 18 October 2007 in Mauritius under the Companies Act 2001 and is governed by the Financial Services Act 2007. On the 29 January 2013,the Company has changed status from Global Business Licence Category 2 (CBG2) to Global Business Licence Category 1 (GBC1).

2. Nature of activities

The main business activities of the Company are that of investment holding, international trading and provision of consultancy and sourcing services.

3. Significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements of the Company comply with the Companies Act 2001 and in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") except of International Accounting Standard 27 ("IAS 27") - Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Standards, amendments and interpretations to the existing standards that are not yet effective

The following standards, amendments to existing standards and interpretations were in issue but not yet effective. They are mandatory for accounting periods beginning on the specified dates, but the Company has not early adopted them:

New or revised standards and interpretations:

IFRS 9 (2009) Financial Instruments: Classification and Measurement effective 1 January 2015 IFRS 9 (2010) Additions to IFRS 9: Financial Instruments effective 1 January 2015

Improvements to standards and interpretations:

IFRS 7 Financial Instruments: Disclosures effective 1 January 2015

IFRS 10 Consolidated Financial Statements: Amendments for investment entities effective 1 January 2014 IFRS 12 Disclosure of Interests in Other Entities effective 1 January 2014

The Company is still evaluating the effect of these new or revised standards and interpretations on the presentation of its financial statements. No early adoption is intended by the Board of Directors.

IFRS 13 Fair Value Measurement

The Standard defines fair value, sets out in a single IFRS a framework for measuring fair value and requires disclosures about fair value measurements. IFRS 13 applies when other IFRSs require or permit fair value measurements. It does not introduce any new requirements to measure an asset or a liability at fair value, change what is measured at fair value in IFRSs or address how to present changes in fair value. The new requirements are effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2013, with earlier application permitted.

3. Significant accounting policies (cont'd)

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IFRS requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies.

There were no major estimates of assumptions made during the year that have a significant risk of causing material adjustment to the carrying amounts of the Company's assets and liabilities within the next financial year.

(b) Income and expenditure

Income and expenditure are accounted for on an accrual basis.

(c) Foreign currency translation

(i) Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements of the Company are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates. The financial statements are presented in United States Dollars (USD), which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

(ii) Transactions and balances

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the foreign exchange rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated into USD at the foreign exchange rates ruling at that date. Non-monetary assets and liabilities that are measured in terms of historical cost in foreign currencies are translated using the exchange rates at the dates of transaction. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

(d) Investment in subsidiary

A subsidiary is an entity in which the Company has an interest of more than one half of the voting rights or otherwise has power to govern the financial and operating policies. The existence and effect of potential voting rights that are presently exercisable or presently convertible are considered when assessing whether the Company controls another entity. Investment in subsidiary is shown at cost. Where the carrying amount of an investment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, it is written down immediately to its recoverable amount and the difference is charged to the statement of comprehensive income. On disposal of the investment, the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount is charged or credited to the statement of comprehensive income.

(e) Other receivables

Other receivables are stated at cost less any impairment losses.

(f) Equity instruments

Equity instruments are recorded at the proceeds received net of direct issue cost.

3. Significant accounting policies (cont'd)

(g) Borrowings

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Borrowings are recognised at cost since they do not have any fixed terms of repayment.

(h) Other payables

Other payables are stated at cost.

(i) Financial instruments

Financial instruments carried on the statement of financial position include borrowings and other payables. The particular recognition methods are disclosed in the individual policy statements associated with each item.

Disclosures about financial instruments to which the Company is a party are provided in note 12.

(j) Related parties

For the purposes of these financial statements, parties are considered to be related to the Company if they have the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the Company or exercise significant influence over the Company in making financial and operating decisions, or vice-versa, or where the Company is subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals or other entities.

During the year 2013, in the process of restructuring of the Company, the Company has purchased the entire shareholding of Fineline Holdings Limited (FHL) into Springleaf Investments Limited, Mauritius (Springleaf). Further, USD 100 million has been invested into ordinary shares of Springleaf. Hence, Springleaf became wholly own subsidiary of the Company.

The Company's entire investment in Magus Estates and Hotels Limited, India (Magus) has been sold to Springleaf for USD 100 million.

Further, the Company's entire investment in Springleaf has been swapped with entire investment (80% shareholding) in Lexon Hotel Ventures Limited (Lexon) of Jaella Asian Holdings Limited, Mauritius (an another group co.). Hence, in the end of restructuring process, Lexon became the subsidiary of the Company.

Further, the Lexon in turn holds 99.76% stake in Leading Hotels Limited, India (Leading). Leading is developing an all Villa Hotel Complex, including residential villas and an 18 hole, 72 par Championship Golf Course in Goa (India).

9. Taxation

The Company has been established as a Category 1 Global Business Licence Company under the Financial Services Act 2007 and is taxable at the rate of 15% for the year ended 31 March 2014. However, the Company is entitled to a tax credit equivalent to the higher of the actual tax suffered on its foreign source of income or 80% of the Mauritian tax. No provision for tax has been made in the financial statements for the year under review due to availability of tax losses.

10. Loss per share

The loss per share is based on loss for the year of USD 1,326,838 (2013: loss USD 81,118,883) and on 65,277,822 average number of ordinary shares during the year 2014 and 20,706,790 average number of ordinary shares during the year 2013.

12. Financial risk management

Fair values

The Company's investment in subsidiary is valued as described in Note 3(d). The Company's other assets and liabilities include other receivables, cash at banks, borrowings and other payables. The carrying amount of these assets and liabilities approximate their fair values.

Financial risk factors

The Company's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks that are associated with the financial instruments in which it invests and markets in which it operates. The following is a summary of the main risks:

Market risk

Market risk represents the potential loss that can be caused by a change in the market value of financial instruments. The Company's exposure to market risk is determined by a number of factors, including interest rates, foreign currency exchange rates and market volatility. The Company conducts its investment operations in a manner that seeks to exploit the potential gains in the market, while limiting its exposure to market declines.

Credit risk

Credit risk represents the potential loss that the Company would incur if counter parties fail to perform pursuant to the terms of their obligations to the Company. The Company limits its credit risk by carrying out transactions only with its related parties. The maximum exposure to credit risk is represented by the carrying amount of each financial asset in the statement of financial position.

Currency risk

The Company has assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies. Consequently, the Company is exposed to the risk that the exchange rate of the United States Dollar, relative to other foreign currencies stated below, may change in a manner which has a material effect on the reported values of the Company's assets and liabilities which are denominated in these currencies.

12. Financial risk management (cont'd)

Capital risk management

The Company's objectives when managing capital are:

- to safeguard the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, so that it can provide returns for shareholders and benefits for other stakeholders, and
- · to maintain an optimal capital structure to reduce the cost of capital.

13. Taxation

The Company has been converted to a Category 1 Global Business Licence company under the Financial Services Act 2007 and is taxable at the rate of 15% for the year ended 31 March 2014. However, the Company is entitled to a tax credit equivalent to the higher of the actual tax suffered on its foreign source of income or 80% of the Mauritian tax. No provision for tax has been made in the financial statements for the year under review due to tax losses.

14. Consolidated financial statements

The Company holds 80 % of the issued share capital of Lexon Hotel Ventures Limited . The company incorporated in Mauritius, is considered to be a subsidiary undertaking. The Company has not prepared consolidated financial statements as required by International Accounting Standard ("IAS 27") 'Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements'. Failure to prepare consolidated financial statements is a departure from the requirements of IAS 27.

15. Events after reporting date

No material events occurred after the year ended 31 March 2014 within the Company, which need to be disclosed in these financial statements.
